### ***A Moment for Reflection***

***Greetings Church Family and Friends,***

***Palm Sunday is this coming Sunday, April 2nd, which means Easter is only a week away! Time certainly moves faster and faster every year! I read a very moving story on Facebook this week concerning Easter and I would like to share it with you.***

#### ***Why did Jesus Fold the Napkin?***

***The Gospel of John (20:7) tells us that the napkin, which was placed over the face of Jesus, was not just thrown aside like the grave clothes. The Bible takes an entire verse to tell us that the napkin was neatly folded and placed separately from them. When Simon Peter arrived at Jesus' tomb and went inside, he noticed the linen wrappings lying there, while the cloth that had covered Jesus' head was folded up and lying to the side. Was that important? Absolutely!! Is it really significant? Yes!!***

***In order to understand the significance of the folded napkin, you have to understand a little bit about Hebrew tradition of that day. Every Jewish servant boy knew this tradition. When the servant set the dinner table for the master, he made sure it was exactly the way the master wanted it. Then the servant would wait, just out of sight, until the master had finished eating. Now, if the master were done eating, he would rise from the table, wipe his fingers, his mouth, and clean his beard, and wad up that napkin and toss it onto the table.***

***The servant would then know to clear the table. For in those days, the wadded napkin meant, 'I'm done.'***

***But if the master got up from the table, and folded his napkin, and laid it beside his plate, the servant would not dare touch the table, because...The folded napkin meant, 'I'm coming back!'***

***He is Coming Back!!***

***Thank you Jesus for that Easter promise!!***
