"Workin, on a Buildin"

The location of the congregations' place of worship from 1889 to 1891 was at the site of the old Federal Building. As early as 1891 they worshiped in a frame building on Scott Street where they remained until 1901. They had begun to make plans for the construction of a new church in 1901 and in February of 1902 a congregational meeting was held to hear from the committee that had been appointed to seek a location for the new church site. (Presbyterians love a committee!!) They voted in October of 1903 to erect a building to cost no less than \$12,000.00 which would seat 325 persons with work to begin in 1905 if the funds could be secured.

Architectural plans for the new building were approved on the 12th of January 1905, despite the fact that the committee appointed to select a location had not yet reported! (Faith!!) Then in February 1905 the property at the corner of McCulloch and Tazewell Streets was purchased and in August of the same year the Scott Street building was sold to the Jewish congregation. Having sold the Scott Street site and being again without a home, the Presbyterian congregation worshiped in the Railroad YMCA building on Roanoke Street until they could finally gather in the new Sunday School Assembly Room at the corner of McCulloch and Tazewell Streets in 1906. Services were held for several years in the Sunday School Assembly Room until the church could be completed in 1912.
